## **Making Spaces for Learning to Thrive**

Major building work has been going on at all three school locations inside Spiti as well as at the Sidhbari hostel outside Spiti. Long-term projects have been completed and new structures begun.



Kaza Public School's second storey is now complete. In use since 2016, at last the building looks properly finished with a bright coat of paint. Flush toilets for summer use and other additions are still being made.

### Rongtong

The main high school building at Rewa Model School, Rongtong has been completed this building season. The school can now expand and continue to educate children for another six years after the

four of primary school. All financial initiative and input, including capital costs, running costs and children' school fees for the whole Rewa Model School project have been from Tibethilfe, Austria, a tremendous humanitarian contribution.



"Re-wa" is the motivating principle behind our school and means "hope" in the Tibetan language and Spiti dialect

The high school inauguration took place on 10th December, World Human Rights Day. Much fundraising and work still need to be done to set up computer and science labs, library, toilets and hostel accommodation.

## Rangrik

At Munsel-ling School a new examination hall is under construction with funding from the local government.

At Munsel-ling there is a new set of girls bathrooms, built with the generous help of the Tibet Relief Fund, UK. Thanks to a better water supply, with storage tanks, the bathrooms feature showers, and summer and winter toilets. Thanks a lot also to the Nantwich Buddhist Group UK for paying for

the solar water heating set-up here.

Also at Munsel-ling, the Hart Trust UK sent money for extra insulation for the primary school block at this winter. This is of the 'plastic sheet over the southern face of the building' type, the dreaded greenhouse effect being put to good use.

Munsel-ling School has a new state-of-the-art science laboratory given by the central government of India. Impressively Munsel-ling is amongst the first batch of schools to be included in this new initiative. Atal Tinkering Labs are dedicated work spaces where students (Class 6th to Class 12th) 'learn innovation skills and develop ideas that will go on to transform India'. They are equipped with 3D printers, cutting-

edge sensors, open source microcontroller boards and the like to enable students to engage with the internet of things, robotics, all that is included in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths).



#### **Sidhbari**

As the students from the higher classes studying inside Spiti now regularly shift to the Sidhbari hostel during the long winter vacation, further infrastructure has been required to accommodate the annual increase in numbers there. This year a much-needed study hall and library have been built, with a stage as well. GATE, a German aid organization has been of great help here. Dr Klaus Rouff, also German, and his group of supporters helped us with a further solar hot water system for the hostel.
